Directions for use:

Print, laminate, and cut apart.

Ideas for use:

Show child each card and ask them the questions.

Explain how one person can use something, but others cannot and why.

Examples:

A mommy can use a curling iron, but a little girl cannot, because she might get burned.

A little girl can play a board game, but a baby cannot, because the baby might choke on the pieces.

OR

Have the child choose cards and answer the questions explaining why it's safe or not safe.
